A Chinese blue and white Batavian ware tea bowl and saucer, Qianlong period, each piece painted with a fan shaped landscape panel, each underside with café-au-lait glaze, height 4.2cm, together with a Chinese blue and white porcelain cup, Kangxi period, painted with flowers, height 7.2cm (chip to rim), and a Chinese blue and white bowl, late Ming dynasty, painted with scrolling tendrils, height 6.5cm (hairline cracks).

Condition Report

1049. Batavian tea bowl and stand - both pieces in good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

Bowl - two cracks to rim (5.5cm and 5cm long), otherwise ok.

Cup - three small chips to rim, otherwise good condition with no cracks or repairs.
