A Chinese blue and white export porcelain vase, Qing dynasty, of square section, the sides painted with a continuous coastal landscape, including pavilions, figure crossing a bridge, trees, islets and mountains, height 33cm (section of rim missing and hairline to one side), with a carved hardwood stand and carved and pierced lotus cover.

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

1084. Missing a 7.5cm x 2.5cm section of rim and some rim chipping next to the missing section. There is also a crack which runs for approx 15cm up one side of the jar and onto the base of the jar. There is another crack which runs over one corner of the base and up 7cm x 4cm into two other sides of the jar. Otherwise the jar is structurally sound with typical light surface wear and scratches.

The wood stand has been made specifically for this piece but is approximately the same size - generally good condition with typical light scuffs and wear.

Cover does not fit and looking at the design would suggest it was made for a censer with upright handles, it has minor surface chips and wear.
