An 18th century provincial elm and ash bacon cupboard settle, the overhanging pediment above a frieze carved with rosette corners, the back fitted with four arch panelled doors, flanked by a pair of scroll arms, the base fitted with two drawers, the reverse with an applied wrought iron bacon rack fitted with six hooks, height 188cm, width 136cm, depth 76cm.

Estimate: £1,000 - £1,500

Condition Report

2001. Overall good colour and rich patina. There is overall historic woodworm to most of the door panels. The right-hand edge of the seat panel appears to have a replacement strip of wood. There has been woodworm or rot damage to the rear right stile and it has lost the bottom 2 or 3 inches. Replacement handles and hinges to doors.
