A Niderviller Sèvres style two-handled vase and pierced cover, 19th century, the bleu céleste glazed oval body with gilt caillouté decoration, painted to one side with two cupids in a gilt oval panel, to the reverse a similar landscape view, above applied bisque floral swags flanked by tall angular handles with bisque mask terminals, raised on an oval foot and rectangular base, the base with applied biscuit plaque, detailed 'Niderviller', the base incised '5547', height 43cm (knop restored).

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

1432. The vase is in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Even the applied flowers and foliage have no noticeable losses or chips - even on very close inspection. The gilding is worn around the foot where you would naturally hold the vase to move it. The cover has a small haircrack to the rim edge approx 2.5cm long and the finial has been professionally restored around its base.
