A small group of decorative ceramics, including two Royal Doulton figures, The Carpet Seller, HN1464 (fault), and Melanie, HN2271, a Beswick elephant, a Cauldon part dressing table set and two pieces of Cauldon decorated with flowers (faults).

Condition Report

1488. Cauldron jug - overall fine crazing to glaze, approx 5cm long horizontal haircrack to middle of body on one side. Minor rubbing to gilt rim and tiny spot where thumb would rest on top of handle.

Cauldron vase - crazing to glaze of foot. Some light wear to gilding on extremities of handles. Minor stain spots to interior.

Cauldron tray - very faint short hairline to rim at 2 o'clock, otherwise ok.

Two Cauldron pots and covers - small with faint vertical haircrack, large in good condition.

Limoges - minute glaze nicks to rim of cup. Chip to foot of jug. Knop of teapot glued, small chip to rim of pot.

Melanie - good condition.

Carpet Seller - chip to right fingers, typical crazing to glaze.

Elephant - both tusks glued, typical crazing.

Bisque - minor chip and crack to top rim edge of shell, otherwise ok.
