### LOT 1513

A pair of Continental porcelain cutlery handles, probably Meissen, 19th century, of pistol shape, each decorated with a seated couple in a landscape opposing an insect above flowers, beneath a low relief floral painted border, unmarked, length 8.5cm, together with a similar basketweave moulded floral painted handle, a blue and white porcelain handle and a white glazed example fitted with a silver blade (faults).

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

1513. Blue and white handle has some chips and losses next to the ferrule and a pin protruding through the pistol end. Glaze is worn and has surface scratches. Some rusting to steel blade and wear and dent to ferrule. White handle - wear and surface scratches to glaze, small firing crack near ferrule and hole to end of handle. Silver blade and ferrule in good order.

Spoon and handle in good order.

Two other handles in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear.
