LOT 1001

A Chinese famille rose porcelain saucer, mark of Xianfeng but probably later Qing dynasty, enamelled with a goddess standing on a lily pad, iron red enamelled seal mark to base, diameter 10.4cm, together with two Chinese famille rose porcelain teabowls, each exterior painted with figures, diameters 10.2cm and 7.5cm, and a famille rose saucer painted with figures and calligraphy, diameter 10.9cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1001. Xianfeng mark saucer - faint starcrack to base otherwise in good condition, only minor wear to gilt, no chips or restoration.

2 graduated bowls - the larger has very small shallow chip to rim, otherwise in good condition with no cracks or restoration. Other bowl in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration. Both with minor wear to gilding and enamels.

Other saucer - 3cm hairline to rim and faint starcrack to base, no chips or restoration.
