LOT 1017

A small group of Chinese porcelain, Qing dynasty, including a blue and white bowl and saucer dish, 18th century, painted with dragons, diameters 12.4cm and 15.5cm, a blue and white vase, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, painted with butterflies and flowers, height 13cm, two circular dishes and two Canton famille rose boxes and covers of barrel/drum form, painted with figural scenes, heights 11.5cm and 9cm (faults).

Condition Report

1017. Blue and white bowl - in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration, but some surface glaze scratches.

Dragon saucer - small chip to rim approx 5 by 3mm, otherwise in good condition with typical surface scratches.

Blue and white vase - in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Famille rose side plate - numerous rim chips/fritting and wear and scratches to enamels and glaze, no cracks or restoration.

Imari dish - 4 and 4.5cm hairlines to rim, numerous small rim chips and wear/scratches to glaze.

Large Canton box - U-shaped hairline crack running down body approx 7cm, across base and then back up body approx 4cm, cover in in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration. Both pieces with typical wear to gilt and enamels.

Small Canton box - circular hairline crack runs around body and base, approx 5.5cm long, chip to inside of rim, cover in generally good order. Both pieces with typical wear to gilt and enamels.
