A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, Qing dynasty, the rectangular body painted with opposing panels of a dragon and a phoenix amidst scrolling lotus tendrils, the side panels with further tendrils and pierced archaic scroll handles, beneath a tapered rectangular neck filled with further scrolling tendrils, height 33cm (restoration).

Condition Report

1067. The main body of the vase has had some significant professional restoration which includes some cracks to the body and glaze fritting to the edges. Some overpainting visible to the naked eye and other restoration only visible under UV light. Also some minor chips to rim.
