A pair of Chinese blue and white export porcelain tea caddies and covers, mid-19th century, each of lobed oval form, painted with opposing panels of birds or butterflies and framed by birds amidst flowers, the shoulders with bats amidst vapours, unmarked, height 20cm (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1196. Covers - both extensively broken into a number of pieces and visibly repaired/restored with some filling and losses along the break lines, one is also missing a larger approx 1cm square section from the base edge. First caddy - neck broken away from body in two large pieces and visibly glued with some minor losses along the break lines, extensive chips/fritting to relief collar at base of shoulders. Second caddy - neck broken away from body in three large pieces and visibly glued with some small losses along the break lines and a larger section of loss approx 1cm square to the top edge. Approx 1 by 0.5cm chip to exterior base edge of foot and a number of chips/frits to relief collar at base of shoulders.
