### LOT 1567

Eight ceramic representations of Queen Victoria, 19th and early 20th century, comprising two Staffordshire figures of the young queen holding an infant, height 19cm, a standing biscuit figure of the young queen, height 18.5cm, a similar seated figure, probably Minton or Derby, height 14cm, a Watcombe terracotta bust, height 15cm, a Robinson & Leadbeater bust, height 22cm, and two Continental bisque busts, heights 19cm and 8cm (faults and repairs).

Estimate: £60 - £100

### Condition Report

1567. Seated biscuit figure - small section to front underside edge of base filed (possibly during manufacture) obviously to hide a blemish. Both hands restored/made-up and left hand visibly glued at wrist. Small nick to necklace, missing right earring. Minute nick to back left chair leg.

Standing biscuit figure - missing object held in right hand and something from left hand too. Bows on dress all chipped. Noticeable firing crack to right inner elbow.

1st Staffordshire - 3 visible glued repairs to Queens right arm and neck - otherwise ok.

2nd Staffordshire - visible glued repair to Queens neck, otherwise ok.

Watcombe Bust - firing blemish to nose, minor nibbling to drapery above front of base.

Small Bisque bust - ok.

Large Bisque bust - manufacturer's firing crack to top of head, otherwise ok.

Robinson & Leadbeater bust - missing 3 small pieces of crown.
