A large pair of Staffordshire spaniels, late 19th century, white glazed with lustre detailing, height 39cm, a smaller pair with black 'Disraeli' detail, height 21.5cm, and a small group of other Staffordshire animals (minor faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

1512. Typical crazing to glaze overall.

Large pair - dog facing right with chip to front feet, glaze chip to back and large firing crack to back of head. Other has small flake to black nose. Both have worn lustre detail and some staining.

Pair Disraeli - dog facing right with significant starcrack to neck, small bruise to top of ear and flaking to nose and eyes. Both with worn gilding.

Copper lustre dog - typical wear to lustre detail.

Black and white dog - chip to front right toes. Crack to lower back of body. Black decoration misfired with minor flaking.

Larger sheep - minor wear to gilding.

Smaller sheep - chip to footrim, misfired nose.

Rabbit - horizontal firing crack around front of base, minor flaking to black.
