### LOT 1509

Two Wedgwood pale blue Jasperware oval plaques, late 18th/early 19th century, the first sprigged in white with a standing cherub holding aloft a bird, height 6.7cm, the second with a vignette of putti, height 4.6cm, impressed uppercase mark to each (tiny nicks), together with three other pieces of Jasperware (faults).

Estimate: £40 - £60

### Condition Report

1509. Single putto plaque - 4 minor nicks to upper surface edge at 3, 5, 6 & 7 o'clock, minute and insignificant nick to drapery. 3 minor nicks to reverse edge.

Vignette plaque - minor nick to reverse base edge, not visible from front, and insignificant white (manufacturing) blemish to front side edge at 3 o'clock.

Green plaque - broken into 4 pieces with some glued repairs and a couple of minor losses along break lines to reverse.

Knob - surface wear but ok.

Stopper - would benefit from clean, otherwise ok.
