A Bow porcelain powder blue ground octagonal plate, circa 1765, painted with fan and circular shaped panels of Chinese landscapes and flowers, pseudo Chinese character mark to base, diameter 20.3cm (faults), together with six pieces of blanc-de-Chine white porcelain with relief prunus sprig decoration, comprising two cups, heights 6cm and 5.5cm, a large and a small teabowl, heights 4cm and 7.7cm, and two saucers, diameters 11.4cm and 10.2cm (faults).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

1556. Plate - large chip to one 'corner' of rim, with other smaller chips/nicks and wear to circumference of rim overall. Significant wear to glazed surface of plate with crazing and light staining visible to underside. Chipping to footrim.

Large teabowl - chip to exterior edge of footrim and top rim. Stain spots to top rim edge and surface wear overall.

Small teabowl - very poor condition overall.

Larger cup - crazed and stained with chipping to top rim edge.

Smaller cup - overall surface wear, long vertical haircrack to rim and shorter alongside with staining.

Smaller saucer - may be a cover? Chipping to edge with 2 short hairlines and extensive scratching to well.

Larger saucer - poor condition overall.
