A Royal Worcester blush ivory jug, circa 1893, decorated after Edward Raby, monogrammed, with a moth amidst poppies and dandelions, gilt decorated moulded rim and handle, puce printed marks to base, shape No. '1229', height 23.5cm, together with three other pieces of Worcester, comprising a lobed jar with liner cover, a squat vase (faults) and a Grainger & Co vase, painted with a titled view of Sullington Church, height 7cm.

Condition Report

1472. Jug - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some loss to gilding on handle.

Sullington Church - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some light rubbing to gilt rim.

Squat vase - 2 chips and glued chip to rim.

Lobed jar - missing main cover but has liner cover. Liner with flaking to gilt knob. Jar in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some flaking/wear spots to gilding.
