A Brannam pottery Toby jug, early 20th century, typically modelled seated holding a jug of ale, incised marks to base, height 20cm, together with a similar smaller example and eight other Toby jugs, including two Hearty Good Fellows (faults and losses).

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

1569. Large Brannam - approx 1.5cm long narrow chip to top rim edge of hat and couple of smaller nicks alongside, typically crazed, otherwise ok.

Small Brannam - typically crazed, otherwise ok.

Shorter and Son Widecombe - small chip to inner rim edge.

Standing with green jacket - typically crazed, otherwise ok.

Small seated Devonmoor - crazed, some bubbling to glaze, otherwise ok.

Seated maroon jacket - cover badly broken and visibly repaired, finely crazed, vertical haircrack to back of hat, minor flaking to jacket.

Seated blue jacket - overall crazing with noticeable haircracks amidst the crazing to body overall, visibly glued section to front brim of hat. Minor enamel flaking.

Seated green jacket - crazed, some misfiring to enamels with minor flaking. Hat ok.

Pink jacket Hearty - extensively crazed, significant enamel flaking. Missing approx one quarter of hat brim with old lifting restoration to remainder back section. Pipe restored.

Brown jacket Hearty - both arms and handle of jug he's holding extensively and poorly restored with similar restoration to neck including badly visible repainting. Missing large section of hat brim.
