A Sèvres style porcelain cobalt blue ground jardinière, mid to late 19th century, of U-shape, painted with a harbourside view of a fisherwoman with two gallants opposing a panel of fruit and flowers, each with gilt framing, flanked by shell handles, pseudo blue painted Sèvres mark to base, height 17cm (faults).

Condition Report

1455. The jardiniere rings nicely when tapped, but does have a branched haircrack running around approx half the circumference of the inner edge of the foot - visible to the underside and the interior - emanating from a firing crack to the outer edge of the foot. A number of small starcracks are also visible to the base interior, along with surface scratches. The blue ground to the exterior is quite pitted overall, probably due to misfiring. There are typical surface scratches to the exterior, one more prominently running horizontally through the neck of the woman on the figural panel. The gilding has typical minor rubbing, particularly to the top rim edge.
