## LOT 1180

A large Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain vase, mid-19th century, the shouldered tapering body with opposing figural scenes of warriors and a dignitary with attendants, below a flared neck with further figural panels, all reserved against a ground of flowers, butterflies and Buddhistic emblems, height 84cm (lacking handles, hairline crack to body and restoration).

## Condition Report

1180. The vase would originally have had handles, these have been lost at some stage and the remaining area on each side of the neck has old, yellowed, peeling, repainted restoration, both of these areas approx 13cm long and 5cm wide - see the close-up images on our website.

There is also a branched starcrack to the shoulders of the vase above the main interior panel on one side, one branch running horizontally between this panel and the neck panel, one branch running vertically down into the body of the bearded warrior on the top left side of the main panel.

Otherwise the vase is in good condition overall with typical light wear and surface scratches to the enamels, glaze and gilding.
