A Chinese famille rose porcelain bottle vase, late Qing dynasty, the compressed globular body painted with bird and flower panels against a yellow ground, filled with green bats amidst pink-blue vapours, the flared neck with further bird panels against a lotus and tendril ground, unmarked, height 38cm (crack to body).

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1154. There is a crack to the body which runs horizontally across the shoulder for approx 10cm and then diagonally for approx 30cm from the shoulder, downwards through the smaller bird vignette and into the yellow ground of the body, along this crack there are some losses to the enamels - particularly the wing of one of the green bats. Otherwise the vase appears to be in generally good condition with good vibrant enamels. There are some minor losses to the enamels and typical wear and surface scratches to the glaze.
