A Chinese famille rose porcelain vase, mid-19th century, the ovoid body typically painted with figural panels with gilt keyfret framing, beneath a similarly decorated flared neck with gilt Buddhist lion cub handles, height 42.5cm (crack to rim and drilled for use as a table lamp).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1054. Hairline crack to rim running diagonally for approx 12cm, along this crack there are minor chips and losses, horizontal glazing blemish/firing crack to inner edge of top rim. Drilled hole near to base where it has been previously used as a lamp. Otherwise in generally good condition with good vibrant enamels, typical minor wear to the enamels and gilding.
