A Chinese Mughal style white/pale celadon jade scribe's case, probably 20th century, with gilt wire and red gem set decoration, the pair of carved cylindrical pen cases and stoppers flanked by a cylindrical inkwell and domed cover, length 26cm (one stopper damaged).

Estimate: £2,000 - £3,000

Condition Report

1255. Generally the piece is in good condition with no significant damage or repairs. There is a small chip to the rim of the well approx 0.5 by 0.3cm, there are also some very minor other chips to all the rims. One of the stoppers has broken and its end is stuck inside the lower tube. The other stopper has some chips to the edges. The stone is a fairly uniform colour. There is some minor mishapping and losses to the wirework, but all stones appear to be present except for one on the well cover.
