A pair of George II silver circular salts, each with scalloped rim and gilt interior, on scallop shell shouldered legs and pad feet, London 1753, height 4.5cm, together with a George III silver mustard of cushion form, London 1806 by Thomas Johnson, length 10.2cm, and a mustard spoon, London 1798 by William Eley & William Fearn.

### Condition Report

414. Pair salts - in generally good condition with no significant damage, both with typical wear commensurate with age. One has a small dent to the side and a repair to its base and the base is a little thin, this repair has made the hallmark indistinct. The other salt with slightly rubbed but readable marks.

Mustard - in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs, typical light wear and surface scratches, good clear hallmarks to base. Spoon also in good order.
