A Chinese export silver tankard by Luen Wo of Shanghai, late 19th century, the cylindrical body profusely chased with figures, pavilions, trees and landscapes framing a shield shaped cartouche with engraved presentation inscription, the applied scroll handle of dragon form, stamped maker's marks to base, height 15cm.

Condition Report

350. In generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. The relief decoration to the body is nice and crisp with good detail, but there is some typical surface wear to high points in particular. There is a small dent to one side of the top rim. The dragon handle is in good order with again only typical light surface wear. The shield shaped cartouche has a presentation inscription and a small dent to one side. The mark to base has minor rubbing but is otherwise clear and readable.
