A Chinese crackle glazed porcelain circular bowl, 20th century, painted with iron red and green dragons, diameter 26cm, together with a pottery Buddhist lion, length 27cm, and a pair of Chinese brass vases, cast with dragons, height 25.2cm.

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1251. Bowl - in good condition overall with no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface wear to decoration.
Lion - overall fine crazing to glaze. One minor firing crack runs from base underside, up middle of back of figure where it branches into two - one branch disappears behind the tail, the other into the mane. There are a number of other smaller firing cracks, for example across the front of the back left leg into the haunches, around base edge and where legs join body. Professional restoration and repainting to base of tail, a number of curled sections at end of tail, both ears and tips of mane sections.
Pair of brass vases - first vase with dragon to neck missing one leg and two dragons on body each missing part of their mane. Second vase in good order.
