A Joan and David de Bethel Rye Pottery model of a seated cat, dated 1967, wearing a pink dress and green highlighted collar and cuffs, the reverse inscribed 'When things are grim good luck I'll bring', set with glass eyes, black painted marks to base, numbered '1857', height 18cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £200 - £300

Condition Report

2.5cm long area of glaze loss to front right side of collar, 3 tiny spots of glaze loss to lowest tip of collar, and some small spots and scratches to glaze over back of cat. Bruised chip approx 1.5 by 0.5cm to back edge of tail, similar at edge between the two front feet and much smaller towards tip end of tail and over front toes. Chipping and glaze loss to tips of ears. Small bruised depression to left side of face with minor glaze loss and similar smaller spot of glaze loss to right side beneath ear.
