A Helena Wolfsohn type Dresden porcelain cup, cover and trembleuse saucer, late 19th century, with floral and figural panels against a gilt ground, diameter saucer 14cm, underglaze blue 'AR' mark to bases, together with a small group of other Dresden porcelain, including two vases and covers in Meissen style and an inkstand, a Sèvres style pot and cover and four pieces of Herend (minor faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

Trembleuse cup and saucer - knob of the cover is glued with some chipping to its relief petals, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Gilding and enamels good with very minor and inconsequential wear.

Inkstand - missing well and cover otherwise in good condition with some wear to gilding.

Larger Dresden vase and cover - main body in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, typical rubbing to gilding. Cover broken into 3 pieces and visibly glued with small area of loss to inner flange and gilt painted over minor chipping to pointed tip of finial.

Smaller Dresden vase and cover - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, typical light wear to gilding.

Pot and cover - main body in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, cover with chip to edge - part of which has a glued repair - with signs of old restoration here.

4 pieces of Herend - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.
