A pair of Parian models of greyhounds, second half 19th century, the seated animals raised on mound bases, unidentified black printed mark to base of one, heights 17cm and 18.5cm (faults and repairs), together with a group of other dog models, including a bisque whippet with coloured detail and a Staffordshire recumbent greyhound, length 11.5cm (faults, restoration and losses).

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

Parian Greyhound with factory mark - the whole animal has been broken away from the base at the feet and visibly glued back with a couple of teeny tiny losses along the break lines, chipping to tips of both ears.

Unmarked Parian Greyhound - minor nick to tip of right ear, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Bisque greyhound - gilding to base worn otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Dogs on green carpet - largest dog missing tip of tail, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Parian recumbent dog on oval base - completely missing at least one dog or other element from base, remaining dog with badly restored right ear, two chips to base edge.

Dog on yellow base - finely crazed with light staining, visibly restored through neck and back raised left leg similarly visibly restored, firing crack to base.

White glazed recumbent dog - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some manufacturing glaze blemishes.

Other two - in generally good order.
