A tin-glazed earthenware albarelo, Spanish, late 17th/early 18th century, of gentle baluster shape, painted in blue with large stylized saz leaves and flowers, height 24cm, together with a vase of tapered high shouldered form painted in a similar pattern, height 23.3cm (minor faults). Provenance: from the collection of the late Professor Maurice Stacey.

Estimate: £150 - £250

Condition Report

Albarelo - 2cm long by 0.5cm wide chip to upper rim edge and two small glaze chips alongside. Horizontal approx 3.5cm long by 0.5cm wide manufacturers firing blemish to body at widest point, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Overall crazing and typical light surface scratches.

Vase - two chips to upper rim edge, largest approx 2.5cm long by 1cm wide with a number of smaller chips/frits to the rim circumference, there are two vertical haircracks to the rim which run into the shoulders, there is some minor fritting to the shoulders on the exterior. Small chips and fritting to the footrim. Overall crazing and typical light surface scratches.
