A Gien faience mantel clock, circa 1900, the white enamel dial within a laurel surround held within a rectangular case of architectural form, decorated to the front with an oval panel of putti within foliate and scroll framing flanked by columns, the sides decorated with garden implements, blue painted factory mark, height 40cm (minor restoration to one foot).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

The front right foot has a filled/made-up repair to its back corner which is fairly visible as it has discoloured with age, it is not visible when viewing the clock from the front. Otherwise the pottery body is in good order with no cracks, chips or restoration. There is some very minor fritting to the laurel wreath framing the dial and a couple of minor nicks/frits to the left top side edge. The enamel dial is in good order apart from a small chip to the 6 of the 60 minute marker where a pin is holding the movement in place.

We cannot guarantee the clock movement to be in working order - it has not been tested. It does not come with a pendulum.

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
