## LOT 1370

A rare Chamberlains Worcester spiral-fluted or shanked spill or potpourri vase, liner and cover, circa 1795, of flattened baluster shape richly enamelled and gilded with a Japan pattern, flanked by shaped gilt enriched handles on an integral oval foot and canted corner rectangular base, the removable liner pierced with fourteen holes, domed cover, unmarked, height 20cm (faults to liner). Note: a similar shaped vase is illustrated by Geoffrey Godden 'Chamberlain-Worcester Porcelain 1788-1852', plate XXII.

## Condition Report

The vase and cover are in lovely condition with no cracks, chips or restoration. The gilding remains good with only minor rubbing, e.g., to the knob of the cover.

The pierced liner has five haircracks running between the pierced holes at different points, otherwise it's in good condition.
