Three small Hispano-Moresque lustre pottery dishes, probably 18th century, two painted with a central stylized bird amidst foliage within a triangular panel, the third with a scrolling foliate pattern, diameters 18.7cm, 19cm and 19.7cm (some faults). Provenance: from the collection of the late Professor Maurice Stacey.

Condition Report

Each dish has been drilled to accommodate a hook.

First bird dish - drilled twice. Faint hairline to rim approx 5cm long. Manufacturer's blemishes to glaze and typical frits/chips to rim. Typical wear.

Second bird dish - quite worn/washed out decoration. Manufacturer's blemishes to glaze and typical frits/chips to rim.

Foliolate dish - quite worn/washed out decoration. Manufacturer's blemishes to glaze and typical frits/chips to rim.
