An English porcelain two handled vase and cover, probably Coalport, circa 1830, the baluster blue ground body painted with opposing floral panels within relief gilt enriched 'C' scroll frames, the elaborate stem, foot, handles and rim all with similar moulding, the pierced cover with floral finial, height 34cm, together with a Derby slop bowl and jug, pattern No. 557.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

Vase and cover - the main body of the vase is in great condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The cover has a teeny tiny nick to the side edge of the rim and some typical minor and indistinct losses to the applied flowers and foliage of the knob.

Derby slop - 2 minor nicks to the footrim, quite indistinct, minor rubbing to top edge of gilt rim, typical light surface scratches to base interior.

Jug - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Minor rubbing to gilding.
