LOT 538

A silver mounted foil backed rock crystal brooch, designed as a starburst, London 1820 (possibly converted from a Friendship Society jewel), weight 15.9g, diameter 5.5cm, a Victorian silver gilt oval hinged bangle in a buckle and strap design, on a snap clasp, Birmingham 1882, weight 33.2g, inside width 6cm, a base metal dress Albertine, a cameo brooch and an agate brooch.

Condition Report

538. Rock crystal brooch – two small chips to the edge of the stone, slight distortion to the silver points, otherwise would benefit from some straightening out as generally quite worn.

Victorian bangle – slightly misshapen, the gilding is a little worn particularly at the back, tongue and box of clasp are out of alignment when open, beading is a bit pierced in places particularly around the buckle.

Dress Albertine – is base metal and has a few old repairs, trumpet button is base metal, foliate motif is a later addition and part of another piece of jewellery.

Cameo brooch – is volcanic lava and rather rubbed.

Agate brooch – hinge and pin missing, claws damaged, evidence of past repair.

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
