### LOT 736

A gold and opal brooch, designed as a crescent, detailed '9ct', weight 6.6g, width 5.2cm (two opals lacking), a gilt metal mounted red paste brooch (converted from a posy holder), a 9ct gold and pale blue gem set solitaire ring, an opal bracelet, a 19th century gilt metal and ivory seal, formed as a clenched fist, height 5.5cm (stone base lacking), and two further items.

Estimate: £150 - £250

### Condition Report

Opal crescent brooch - opals have an attractive play of colour, one or two have small edge chips, but opals generally in good condition. Safety pin associated and has 9ct gold hallmark, this fitting probably originally top of a hair comb. Two opals lacking.

Red paste brooch - converted from posy holder, currently a bit crushed and requires straightening, brooch pin fitting associated. All pastes present. Length 9.8cm.

Solitaire ring - surface wear, a bit rubbed, needs cleaning, ring size N.

Opal bracelet - some surface wear to opals, limited play of colour - mostly pale blue - some distortion to links, no marks but possibly silver gilt. Possibly made from front of a necklace, looks handmade in Arts and Crafts style and lacks a way of securing it to the wrist and possibly partially made/finished.

Seal - ivory has cracks, stone lacking from base, base is gilt metal. Suspension loop is a later fitting.

Figural brooch - pin fitting a later addition, small bit broken from top, possibly an element from another object.

Jade earring - medium to pale colour saturation. Detailed to back 'China' and then 'Silver'. Diameter 1.7cm.

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
