A set of six George V silver liqueur glass holders, each embossed in the Dutch style with figures, flanked by a scroll handle, London 1923 by James Dixon & Sons Ltd, total height 4.7cm, cased, together with a small group of other silver items, including an octagonal jewellery box, London 1911, a four-division toast rack and a mustard.

Condition Report

385. Mustard - generally good condition. Hinge a little loose, but no significant damage or repairs. Good clear marks and blue glass liner in good order.

Toast rack - good condition. Typical light wear and scratches. Good clear marks.

Ovoid pepper - some surface wear and scratches. Marks slightly rubbed.

Reeded ovoid pepper - some surface scratches and wear. Marks slightly rubbed.

2 ashtrays - each monogram engraved, slight misshaping to rim, otherwise ok.

Small case with sprung hinge lid - engraved 'Press Club London' crest to front and engraved inscription to interior, dated 12-12-31. Otherwise generally good condition.

Octagonal box - worn with dents and misshapen. Hinge does not close properly.

All six silver and glass measures in good order. Box is a little scuffed.
