LOT 1212

Two Chinese jade belt hooks, probably late Qing dynasty, each of typical serpentine form, the first carved and pierced with a chilong confronting the dragon head terminal, the stone of pale celadon tone, length 9.6cm (repaired), the other carved and pierced with a bird, foliage and phoenix head terminal, the pale celadon stone with pale brown inclusions, length 10cm.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

Dragon belt hook - the carved and pierced chilong surmount has been broken off across the feet and re-glued, and one of the front feet is now missing, otherwise the belt hook itself and the dragon terminal are in good condition.

Phoenix belt hook - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

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
