A Chinese famille rose and underglaze blue export porcelain meat dish, Qianlong period, the centre painted with a scene of figures in a landscape, length 26.5cm (minor rim chip repair), together with a famille rose enamelled café-au-lait ground plate, diameter 22.3cm (hairline), and a famille verte black ground porcelain saucer dish, mark of Kangxi but late Qing dynasty, painted with figures, diameter 23.2cm.

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

Meat dish - tiny insignificant shallow glaze chip to upper rim edge at 1 o'clock, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks or repairs, minor wear to enamels.

Plate - there is a crack across the edge of the circumference of the footrim to the base, approx 6cm long, otherwise no chips or restoration. There is surface wear and scratches to enamels and glaze.

Saucer dish - no cracks, chips or restoration, but significant loss and wear to black ground - please use the zoom function to view the images on our website - and other typical surface scratches and wear.
