LOT 1084

A Chinese famille rose porcelain vase, mark of Qianlong but 20th century, the ovoid body painted with opposing figural scenes, reserved against a ruby ground filled with lotus and scrolling tendrils, beneath a ruyi head collar, between a pair of moulded elephant mask and gilt ring handles, the flared neck filled with polychrome lotus and scrolling tendrils on a yellow ground, blue enamelled four-character mark to base, height 40cm.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

In generally good condition, with good vibrant colours, there is a small section of the rim which has been professionally restored and overpainted. Typical light wear to gilding and enamels and minor surface scratches. Losses to ruby ground enamel on sides of vase predominantly - not terribly noticeable due to scroll pattern. The footrim is slightly uneven which means there is a slight wobble - a manufacturing issue. Good clear blue enamelled mark to base.
