## LOT 1099

A Chinese famille rose enamelled export porcelain teabowl, Yongzheng period, the exterior painted with leaf shaped panels of fruit and landscapes against an iron red cell diaper ground, height 4.5cm, diameter 8.7cm (small hairline to rim), together with a famille rose teabowl and saucer, Qianlong period, painted and gilt with fenced chrysanthemum gardens, total height 4.7cm (star hairline crack to base of saucer), and a famille rose export porcelain teabowl, Qianlong period, painted with flowers, diameter 7.6cm (hairline to rim).

## Condition Report

Yongzheng teabowl - 0.5cm long vertical haircrack to rim running from small black blemish, otherwise in good condition overall with no restoration or chips. Wear to black enamel used to outline panels and interior band, otherwise ok.

Teabowl and saucer - five branch starcrack to centre of saucer which also has small chip to inner rim edge of footrim and minor wear to enamels where teabowl sits. Teabowl with indistinct short vertical hairline to rim and similar to base, footrim has rough manufacturing finish to exterior edge.

Export teabowl - 2cm vertical hairline and a 0.5cm vertical hairline to rim, otherwise in good condition with some typical wear to enamels and light surface scratches.
