### LOT 1096

A pair of Chinese blue and white porcelain vases and covers, marks of Kangxi but late 19th century, each baluster body painted with figures, pagoda and pavilions in landscapes, underglaze blue four-character mark to base, height 36cm (one cracked and with repaired cover).

Estimate: £100 - £200

### Condition Report

Vase one - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The cover is in generally good condition, but both ears of the buddhistic lion finial are chipped and there are a couple of small chips to the rim.  
Vase two - a crack runs from the rim for approx 16cm, vertically down the body, halfway along the crack there are 4 diagonal haircracks branching off at angles. No chips or restoration. The cover is in poor condition with chipped and re-glued finial, a section of rim broken out in 2 pieces and re-glued, and a section of inner rim broken and missing.
