A Chinese blue and white porcelain vase, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, the baluster body painted with a pair of confronting dragons, flaming pearl and vapours, underglaze blue four-character mark to base, height 20.3cm (minor rim restoration), together with a small group of other blue and white porcelain, late 19th/early 20th century, comprising two double gourd vases, heights 25.5cm and 24cm, a pair of bottle vases, height 20.7cm, and a ginger jar, height 13.2cm (faults).

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

Dragon vase - narrow poor restoration to approx half of rim circumference, otherwise in good condition.

Ginger jar - light surface scratches to widest part of body, lacking cover, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Pair of vases - first with large U-shaped section broken and re-glued from neck with associated triangular section missing from rim, otherwise ok. The second vase has a similar large U-shaped section broken away in 2 pieces and visibly poorly repaired with some poor filling to the rim and along the break lines.

Taller gourd vase - large section of body badly broken and re-glued with a small missing section amidst this area.

Smaller gourd vase - broken and re-glued through section between the two bulbs of the vase, minor manufacturer's glaze blemishes to vase overall, otherwise ok.
