A pair of Chinese famille rose porcelain vases, late 19th century, each shouldered tapering body and flared neck with gilt Buddhist lion handles and applied chilong to shoulders, painted with panels of birds and flowers reserved against a turquoise ground filled with lotus and tendrils, height 25.5cm.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

Vase One - generally in good condition, one of the buddhistic lion handles has a chip to its tail, the chilong shoulders have a few very minor chips to the high points, otherwise the vase has no apparent cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and gilt - particularly on the high points of the applied animals. Good vibrant colours.

Vase Two - generally in good condition with no significant damage or repairs, small chip to underside of rim approx 0.5 by 0.3cm, typical light surface wear to gilt and enamels - particularly on the high points of the animals. Good vibrant colours.
