A pair of Chinese Canton famille rose enamelled celadon ground porcelain vases, mid to late 19th century, each baluster body painted with opposing figural panels reserved against a celadon ground filled with flowers, fruit and insects, each flared neck applied with gilt chilong and pierced gilt handles, height 24.5cm (minor restoration).

Estimate: £100 - £200

Condition Report

Vase One - the neck has been broken where it joins the body and been re-glued with restoration to both handles and the heads of the applied dragons, otherwise the rest of the body appears in reasonably good condition with typical light surface wear. Good vibrant colours.

Vase Two - in better condition with typical wear and light surface scratches, chipped eyes to dragons and wear to gilt handles. Good vibrant colours.
