A collection of Chinese pottery and works of art, 19th century and later, including a turquoise glazed vase, modelled with bamboo and chrysanthemum, height 23.5cm, a pair of famille verte enamelled biscuit porcelain Buddhistic lions, height 23.5cm, and a famille verte yellow ground ginger jar and cover, height 14.5cm.

Condition Report

Turquoise vase - generally in good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Minor chips to rim and flower edges.

Wucaï vase - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Yellow ground ginger jar and cover - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Typical wear to enamels.

Famille rose ginger jar - lacking cover, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Typical light surface scratches and wear.

Celadon ground vase - damaged neck, hairline cracks and restoration.

Crackle glazed ginger jar - no significant damage or repair, but some discolouration and wear to enamels.

Yixing Teapot - In good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. Some wear to the brown patina.

Pair of Buddhistic lions - both in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs, both with typical scratches and wear.

Kutani teapot - overall light crazing to glaze, small chip to spout, otherwise generally in good condition with a couple of very minor small hairlines to the rim, enamels and gilt with light minor wear. Wicker handle a little unwoven.

Red lacquer box - typical light wear.

Two wood figures - generally in good condition, minor nicks at high points.
