A George III silver three-piece tea set, comprising teapot, cream jug and two-handled sugar bowl, each of half-reeded cushion form with gadrooned and foliate rims, on bun feet, London 1814 by Rebecca Emes and Edward Barnard, total weight 1206g, length of teapot 29cm.

Condition Report

414. Tea set is in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. It has typical surface wear and scratches commensurate with age and there are engraved monograms to each circular panel on both sides of all three pieces. Would certainly benefit from a clean.

Teapot - hinge lid and finial are good and closes tightly. Spout and handle in good order. The most significant damage to the set is a dent to one of the back corners which runs through the hallmark. This can be seen in our online image. Good clear hallmark.

Milk jug - handle in good order. Feet in good order. Numerous very minor dents to body reeding. Good clear hallmark.

Sugar bowl - handles are good, few very minor dents to body but nothing significant. Good clear hallmarks.
