LOT 1089

A George III Welsh inlaid oak longcase clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the 12-inch square brass dial with matt centre, date aperture and applied oval plaque inscribed 'In Owen Llanrwst', the hood with moulded pediment above a scroll pierced fretwork frieze, glazed door and turned columns, the trunk door with inlaid roundel motif, on a panelled base, height 207cm, with pendulum and two weights (some faults).

Condition Report

1089. The clock is in generally good decorative condition commensurate with age. The movement and dial is a little dirty and would benefit from a clean to get it back to good working order. The case is in generally good order but it has had some work/restoration over the years. This includes a later stained pine backboard and a later pierced frieze on the hood. There is some minor damage to the case, including a split at the top of one of the hood columns, small piece of inlay missing to bottom corner of hood door, lock has been replaced and panel to base is warped, as well as typical scuffs and nicks that you would expect. Most of the issues can be seen in the photographs online. It is difficult to tell whether the case and movement started life together, but the movement and seatboard sit comfortably in place without any obvious signs of adaptations, such as padding etc. It is a nice decorative clock.
