An early 19th century mahogany circular wall timepiece with brass eight day single fusee movement, the 13½-inch silvered convex dial with black Roman hour numerals and inscribed 'A. Meyer Bristol', within a moulded circular surround with cast brass bezel and convex glass, the case with hinged doors to side and underside, case diameter 38cm, with pendulum. Note: Anthony Meyer is recorded in 'Watchmakers and Clockmakers of the World' by Brian Loomes as working in Bristol between 1815 and 1834.

Condition Report

1108. The clock appears to be in generally good condition which can be seen in the images on our website. The dial is a little dirty. The key that is pictured in place on the brass bezel does not actually work the lock, it is simply being used to open the front. Mahogany surround is in good order, the case box has had some restoration/re-polishing, but is in good order. Replacement peg to trap door. The movement winds and is currently running but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

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
