A George III mahogany circular wall timepiece, the brass eight day single fusee movement with verge escapement, the 10-inch silvered circular dial with black Roman hours and outer Arabic minutes, inscribed 'JNo Lloyd, Minories, London', within a moulded circular surround, the case box with hinged doors to side and underside, diameter 36cm. Note: John Lloyd is recorded in 'Watchmakers and Clockmakers of the World' by Brian Loomes as working at Minories, London, in 1781.

Condition Report

1103. It is difficult to be certain to the originality, due to the enclosed nature of the movement and the fact the case does not separate to give a better view. It looks like the clock has had some restoration and later fittings, including brass hinge and screws and re-polishing. We would suggest it may well be a marriage. The movement winds smoothly but only runs for a minute or two.

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
