A George III figured mahogany longcase clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the 12-inch engraved silvered breakarch dial with strike/silent indicator to arch above Roman hours, Arabic outer minutes and subsidiary seconds and date dials, inscribed 'JnO Catton Gibraltar', the hood with pagoda top flanked by brass ball and spire finials above a glazed door and brass stop fluted columns, the arched trunk door flanked by brass stop fluted corner columns, on a panelled base and moulded plinth with bracket feet, height 242cm, with pendulum and two weights.

Condition Report

1155. The clock is in generally good condition if a little dirty and dusty. No significant damage or repairs. Typical minor splits to veneers to either side of trunk and hood, but nothing out of the ordinary. Trunk door ever so slightly warped in lower left corner, but otherwise in good order and locks with key. There are no obvious signs (packing to cheeks, etc) to suggest the clock is a marriage, but difficult to be absolutely certain. The movement winds smoothly and runs and striking mechanism working but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.
