## LOT 1125

A George III mahogany mantel timepiece with brass eight day single fusee movement, the backplate inscribed 'Thos Robbins Chatham', the similarly signed painted 5-inch circular convex dial with black Roman hours, the dome top case with ebony stringing to front and pierced gilt brass scale fret panels to sides, on a plinth base and brass ball feet, height 28.5cm, with pendulum. Note: Thomas Robbins is recorded in 'Watchmakers and Clockmakers of the World' by Brian Loomes as working in Chatham, Kent, circa 1740 to 1780.

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## Condition Report

1125. The timepiece is in generally good restored condition. The case has no significant damage or repairs. The dial has some crazing visible and some re-touching to paintwork particularly around the winding hole where there has been some minor chips. The movement winds smoothly and is currently running but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch. Bezel is a later replacement.
